The net proceeds of this unique fundraiser have grown to become the largest single source of unrestricted funds for both parties. This amazing partnership has benefitted both organizations in providing programs and support to our community, the region and the world.

Welcome to the 2022 Lake Oswego Rotary/Lakewood Center for the Arts Lobster Feed and Charity Auction!

Now in its 38th year, the auction has raised more than \$3.9 million dollars to benefit non-profit organizations, community projects, the arts and humanitarian needs in our community, state, and the world! The auction is highly anticipated and attended by more than 600 people who generously give to help fund and support humanitarian and community causes through **Lake Oswego Rotary** as well as supporting theatre, arts programs, and youth outreach at **Lakewood Center for the Arts**.

In addition, a portion of the net proceeds will continue to benefit these and other causes:

Hunger Fighters Food Pantry

Hunger Fighters Oregon first started as an after school club at Lake Oswego Junior High. The student run group met once a week and planned food drives and other school fundraisers. In 2016, Hunger Fighters Oregon became an official nonprofit organization and currently operates a food pantry adjacent to Lake Oswego High School. The food pantry distributes basic food and hygiene items to families and individuals in the Lake Oswego community.

Easterseals Oregon Summer Camp for Kids

Easterseals Oregon recognizes the gifts and potential of their campers. The camp creates an environment that emphasizes the campers abilities and independence as well as the development of their social skills and appreciation and knowledge of the outdoors. For some campers, this is their only summer vacation, as traveling with special needs can involve added challenges and expense. The camp is held at the Evans Camp Retreat in early July.

Clackamas Women's Services

Incorporated in 1985, Clackamas Women's Services offers comprehensive, sensitive solutions for adults and children impacted by sexual assault, domestic violence, stalking, sexual exploitation and trafficking and elder abuse. At their secure emergency shelter, rural outreach offices, Clackamas Community College, DHS, Camp HOPE America-Oregon, and A Safe Place Family Justice Center, CWS coordinates services with other public and private agencies in order to best serve survivors seeking help.

2022 Lobster Feed and Charity Auction Special Appeal

This year's special appeal is to support SAGE (Support of Adolescent Girl Empowerment) and specifically the of adolescent girl empowerment. In 2017, a bold leap to address the low quality of education available to Indigenous young women in rural Guatemala was made and the MAIA Impact School opened. The school offers a rigorous academic curriculum designed to meet the needs of the 21st century and prepare Girl Pioneers to enter university and the formal workplace.

When we include girls in education, health and economic investment we have a better chance of preventing issues such as child marriage, teen pregnancy, HIV/AIDS and breaking the intergenerational cycle of poverty. But girls can't do it alone; they need the world to listen to them and invest in their potential.
