

THE ART CONSPIRACY Summer Arts Program 2024

June 17–28 • Amity Middle School

In cooperation with the Amity School District, we will hold our 23rd Summer Arts Program at the Amity Middle School. It is open to students ages nine though high school from Yamhill and Polk counties. Preference will be given to students from Amity, Sheridan, Willamina, and Grand Ronde who register prior to June 1.

The Summer Arts Program consists of eight days of 2½ hour morning and afternoon classes. The classes will be held weekdays Monday, June 17 through Thursday, June 27. On Friday, June 28 starting at 5:30 pm there will be a performance and art exhibition at the middle school.

Courses are taught by working artists and educators. Classes are limited to 10 students to maximize learning, with a few exceptions. Classes with low enrollment may be canceled.

All classes will be held at Amity Middle School in Amity. Bussing will be provided to and from Sheridan, Willamina, and Perrydale.

The program is funded through tuition, grants, and private donations from local individuals, non-profit organizations and businesses.

REGISTRATION

Registration is open to students in Yamhill and Polk counties with priority given to students from Amity, Sheridan, Willamina, Grand Ronde and Perrydale. Classes are filled on a first-come, first served basis. Early registration is encouraged. A non-refundable deposit of \$50 is due with registration. The balance is due by the first day of classes. No refunds will be given after June 10. Students may register from 8:30 - 9am on June 17 as space permits with an additional \$35 late fee. Class choices will be very limited at that point. LUNCHES

The Amity School District does not currently offer the USDA Free Lunch program. Parents are encouraged to provide a sack lunch. However in conjunction with the Amity food bank and Churches United for West Valley we will be able to provide sack lunches to students who are unable to bring one.

ATTENDANCE

Students are expected to attend all classes and the final performance and exhibit on Friday, June 28. Attendance will be taken daily. Due to the nature and quality of the classes we offer, missed days cause significant disruption to class content and impact all attendees—including the student missing classes. Partial attendance is strongly discouraged. Prolonged illness refunds will be determined on a case-by-case basis.



STUDENT CONDUCT

Students should be courteous and respectful to teachers, staff, and fellow students. Students who are disruptive to the program may be asked to leave and may jeopardize future enrollment. Financial aid students who are disruptive will not be allowed to enroll the following year.

We encourage students to wear loose, comfortable clothing that can be discarded without regret as some classes get very messy. Shorts, jeans, and t-shirts are advised.

The use of electronic devices is not permitted during classes. If possible, please leave electronic devices at home. Any electronic device used during class will be confiscated until the end of the day.

DANCE


Noah Miller

Explore beginning musical theater dance styles in a fun environment that encourages experimentation, learning from mistakes, working with your natural flexibility and stage presence, and working with others.

INTRODUCTION TO RELIEF PRINTMAKING

Eric Frey

Students will be exploring the interesting world of printmaking by taking different approaches to creating art prints. We will be exploring transforming a picture into a print, transforming northwest fish into prints (no real fish will be used for this project), and creating a limited edition of linocut prints based on a student drawing.



SKETCHBOOK DRAWING ADVENTURES

This class will lead students through making small sketchbooks, then practicing drawing skills to design their own artistic pages. We'll finish with shore graphic novels and story maps.

EMBROIDERY & BASIC SEWING

Jessica Rehfield

Exploring the differences between sewing and embroidery, students learn a set of basic stitches common to both hand-sewing and embroidery including running, back, cross, and whip stitches, and more advanced stitches like feather, chain, and French knot. Students will create a sampler using embroidery hoops, explore mending and sew-on patches using fabric as an art medium. We experiment with sewing alternative materials, plan a design, and use design skills to create a final project that incorporates both sewing and embroidery skills.

SMARTPHONE PHOTOGRAPHY

Rusty Rae

This course will give smartphone users the opportunity to take control of their image-making with their devices. From holding the smartphone for the sharpest images to understanding how to adjust the smartphone camera for exposure. Additionally, students will learn to edit their images using applications such as Adobe Lightroom, Adobe Photoshop, Snapseed, and others. Students will solidify their learnings through specific assignments leading to a portfolio of images to be printed for the final day exposition.

SCULPTURE EXPLORATION

Stephanie Juanillo

From paper-mache, assemblage, to found object and collaborative sculptures, each student will learn how to mold, shape, and assemble different materials to create a one of a kind masterpiece. Whether making whimsical creatures, abstract forms, or miniature worlds, the class will help kids expand their creativity and imagination while developing basic sculpting skills.

DRAMA

Caroline Goin

Cari will be providing an exciting, dynamic experience for kids of all ages and abilities to explore a fairytale and turn it on its head! Kids will explore themes in a fairytale then fracture it, using their imaginations to retell the story from their unique point of view. Students will play drama games and learn to improvise as well as create a play. Finally, students will present a fun-filled performance of their creation to family and friends!

FUN FELTING

Students will discover

felting and wet felting, how to manipulate fibers, blend colors and add intricate details to each project. Our goal will be to develop patience, focus, and problem-solving abilities that foster confidence and self-expression.

WATERCOLOR ILLUMINATIONS

Students will explore the world of medieval illuminated manuscript art using watercolor techniques to create illuminated and decorated page elements. The final project will be a custom designed illuminated page.

ITALIC CALLIGRAPHY

Melvin Lee

Calligraphy is the art of beautiful writing. Italic is basic to beginning calligraphers. Students will be introduced to calligraphic tools: nibs, fountain pens, and ink.

Construction of capital and lowercase letter forms will be practiced in addition to proper pen angle, and spacing of letters and words.

RHYTHM AND BUCKET BEATS

Would you believe that a bucket can be used to make some awesome music? In this class, students will learn basic rhythm notation, playing in a beginning percussion ensemble, and learning how to craft simple rhythmic compositions.

ZINES

lessica Rehfield

Students will make folded zines, including poetry and collage zines. These zines will include an 8-page folded zine (with surprise interior page), 12 and 14 page folded zines, giant group zine, accordion-folded zine, and expanded practice zines with lost-and-found poetry, collage arts, stitching and stapled pages. Students will combine and explore zine-making with illustrated and story-telling zines and skills that can be easily repeated. The poss "-zine-" bilities are endless!

Sonia Allen is a painter, printmaker, sketchbook artist and avid knitter. Since 1998 she has been a teaching artist throughout the Willamette Valley with Salem Art Association, Bush House Museum, and Ash Creek Center. Sonia has led youth art sessions on International ministry trips. In 2017 she was awarded a grant to use art and science to educate children in Pierce County, WA, about invasive weeds. In 2022 she taught at Kraxberger Middle School in Oregon City as part of a grant from the Lake Oswego Center for the Arts.

ERIC J. FREY

Eric J. Frey is an interdisciplinary artist based in Dallas, Oregon primarily focused on the phenomena of creating artwork dealing with concepts of memory and thought transference through objects. Eric is currently an adjunct art instructor at Chemeketa Community College. 24 years of military experience have shaped his believes in the transient presence, and the necessity to create in a world filled with destruction. He has a BFA in Art and Design from Western Oregon University, and an MFA in Studio Arts at Studio Arts College International in Florence, Italy. His work ranges from digital photography, woodblock and linoleum prints, installations, to sculptural works in local, regional, national, and international art exhibitions.
