MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT, NANCY PORTER:

Several newer members have asked me what the duties would be if you volunteer.

- If you volunteer at Main Street Fairmont (the 3rd Saturday 10-3 from May to September), you would just sit/stand at our table and hand out brochures about the club, sell baked goods/chips/sodas. Water is free. Set up is around 9:30. You would need to bring your own chair and someone needs to bring a table. Sometimes we raffle off a basket or do 50/50. See Rae or Julie if you're interested in helping with that. Usually 2-3 people are needed.
- If you volunteer at the Mon County Center/Mylan Park events, they are in June, October and December from 10-4. Set up around 9:30. Basically the same duties as Main Street, except we don't sell food or soda. Usually 2-3 people are needed. Bring a chair. Let me know if you'd like to help.
- If you volunteer for an event at the clubhouse, if you are assigned to the first shift, it would be getting the food ready to put out in the dining room. It might mean cutting veggies for salad, mixing the salad mixing up chicken salad, or cutting cake and putting on small plates, getting the pitchers made up for tea and lemonade, putting ice in bowl for drink table, carrying out the pitchers, getting serving dishes out, washing dishes as you go, etc. Contact Diana Dunn to volunteer.
- If you volunteer for cleanup for an event at the clubhouse, it would mean clearing the tables once everyone has finished eating, tossing trash, rinsing dishes, washing dishes, loading the dishwasher, carrying remaining food into the kitchen, taking trash to outside cans, sweeping the event room floor, etc. Contact Diana Dunn to volunteer.



When a victim of sexual assault reports the assault, a doctor or nurse will photograph, swab, and conduct an invasive and exhaustive examination of the victim's entire body for DNA evidence left behind by the attacker. The process may take four to six hours to complete. The victim assumes the evidence will be utilized to its fullest extent and in a timely manner to bring a perpetrator to justice. The reality is that there are still thousands of rape kits sitting in law enforcement evidence rooms or awaiting testing at state and local crime labs. Congress can take action to eliminate this backlog. Let's work to support survivors with the justice they deserve and hold perpetrators accountable.

Please urge Congress to pass the bipartisan Debbie Smith Act of 2023 which provides vital funding to state and local law enforcement agencies and crime labs nationwide to improve DNA collection and analysis, eliminate the rape kit backlog, and enhance state and local prosecutors' capacity to bring these cases to court.

One of the most important methods to identify and prosecute sexual predators is through DNA analysis. State and local law enforcement need the federal government's resources to efficiently analyze and process DNA evidence from sexual assault, homicides, and rape kits. It is time to put an end to the backlog of untested and unanalyzed DNA evidence and hold perpetrators accountable. Please urge Congress to enact H.R. 1105/S. 499, the Debbie Smith Act of 2023. CALL YOUR CONGRESSMAN!!!
