Emergency Shelter

Emergency shelters are committed to assisting individuals and families impacted by homelessness in Arlington by creating a path to self-sufficiency. They offer a continuum of individualized services to increase their guests' probability of long-term success.

Emergency Shelters stand in the gap during seasons of inclement weather. When weather conditions become hazardous for individuals to be outdoors overnight, the Cold Weather Overflow Emergency Shelter Response Plan is initiated. Emergency Shelters provide temporary accommodations to shield the unhoused from the cold.



Non-emergency situations are those that may not require immediate intervention. The non-emergency number connects directly to the Arlington Police Department's duty phone. These calls are not dispatched over the radio unless the officer advises such action.

Via Arlington

Via is an on-demand rideshare service that will pick-up and drop-off riders anywhere in the Arlington city limits plus the CentrePort TRE Station. The service runs 6 a.m.-9 p.m. Monday through Friday and 9 a.m.-9 p.m. on Saturdays. Rides cost 3-\$5 per person per ride, depending on distance. Book your ride through the Via app or by calling 817-784-7382 if you do not have a smart phone. The Via van will pick you up and drop you off within a 1-2 block walk.
